

HONORING CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN ON 30 YEARS AS PRESERVED PARKLAND

WHEREAS, FROM THE MID-1950S UNTIL 1978, THE SITE OF THE CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN WAS COMPRISED OF TWO ABANDONED LOTS RIDDLED WITH RUBBLE, RUSTED OUT CARS, TRASH AND OTHER DEBRIS; AND

WHEREAS, IN 1978, WEST 48TH STREET RESIDENTS ORGANIZED TO CLEAN UP THE LOTS, AND, WITH ASSISTANCE FROM THE VOLUNTEER ORGANIZATION GREEN GUERILLAS, LEASED THE SITE FROM THE CITY; AND

WHEREAS, DEDICATED VOLUNTEERS CREATED AND TENDED TO A PUBLIC FRONT GARDEN WITH A LAWN AND FLOWER BEDS AND A BACK AREA WITH INDIVIDUAL 5' X 8' PLOTS; AND

WHEREAS, IN 1982, VOLUNTEER GARDENERS AND COMMUNITY MEMBERS UNITED WITH HOUSING CONSERVATION COORDINATORS, THE TRUST FOR PUBLIC LAND AND THE GREEN GUERILLAS TO STOP A CITY PLAN TO AUCTION OFF THE LOTS; AND

WHEREAS, THAT FIGHT LED TO THE LAUNCH OF AN INNOVATIVE AND WILDLY SUCCESSFUL \$5-PER-SQUARE-INCH FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN, AIDED BY A SUBSTANTIAL GIFT FROM THE CLINTON FUND, SO THAT CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN WAS IN A POSITION TO TRY TO PURCHASE THE PROPERTY FROM THE CITY ITSELF; AND

WHEREAS, IN THE FACE OF STRONG AND HIGH-PROFILE SUPPORT FOR THE GARDEN, IN 1984, THE CITY REVERSED COURSE ON ITS PLANNED AUCTION AND INSTEAD TRANSFERRED THE PROPERTY TO PARKS DEPARTMENT JURISDICATION, MAKING CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN THE FIRST COMMUNITY GARDEN IN NEW YORK CITY TO BE GRANTED PERMANENT PARKLAND STATUS; AND

WHEREAS, OVER THE PAST 30 YEARS, CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN HAS CONTINUED TO THRIVE, BOASTING 108 INDIVIDUAL PLOTS IN THE REAR GARDEN, A PUBLIC FRONT LAWN INCLUDING A GRAPE ARBOR, ROCK GARDEN AND FLOWER BEDS, AND A WINDING NATIVE AMERICAN TRAIL WITH OVER 100 INDIGENOUS, MEDICINAL PLANTS; AND

WHEREAS, TO FURTHER SERVE THE COMMUNITY, CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN HOSTS EVENTS RANGING FROM POTLUCK DINNERS TO DANCE RECITALS AND ALSO SERVES AS A CLASSROOM FOR SCIENCE AND ART STUDENTS; NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, THAT I, NEW YORK STATE SENATOR BRAD HOYLMAN, RECOGNIZE THAT IN **CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN** WE HAVE AN ORGANIZATION WORTHY OF OUR HIGHEST RESPECT AND ESTEEM; AND BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, THAT I, NEW YORK STATE SENATOR BRAD HOYLMAN, DECLARE SEPTEMBER 30, 2014 TO BE **CLINTON COMMUNITY GARDEN DAY** IN NEW YORK STATE'S 27TH SENATE DISTRICT.
